Rules for Students 1872

- Respect your schoolmaster. Obey him and accept his punishments.
- Do not call your classmates names or fight with them. Love and help each other.
- 3. Never make noises or disturb your neighbors as they work.
- 4. Be silent during classes. Do not talk unless it is absolutely necessary.
- 5. Do not leave your seat without permission.
- 6. No more than one student at a time may go to the washroom.
- 7. At the end of class, wash your hands and face. Wash your feet if they are bare.
- 8. Bring firewood into the classroom for the stove whenever the teacher tells you to do this chore.
- 9. Go quietly in and out of the classroom.
- If the master calls your name after class, straighten the benches and tables. Sweep the room, dust, and leave everything tidy.
