Walk away

gnore

Talk it out

Seek help

Conflict on the playground may emerge as students are expected to share playground equipment, take turns in games, and respond to defeat. The WITS approach helps children develop positive, pro-social behaviors and skills for resolving conflicts both in and outside of school.

To help supervisors effectively respond to conflict on the playground, your child is encouraged to seek help if the other strategies are not working or if they are not yet ready to implement one themselves. When we get delivered news of a conflict in a timely manner, we can respond and assist the students with a peaceful resolution.

Tuesday, November 4, 9 AM, photo retakes will




take place! We'll also have our class and panoramic school photo done. Send your beautiful little people to school all dressed up and ready for their super star moment!
