Dear Parents and Guardians,

At school, we focus on academic growth as well as character growth and as we near the end of October, it is time to share some of this journey. Assessment results, falcon awards, and time to talk about learning are just some of the ways that we can share some of the growth of your child with you.

If you have a child in grade 4 or 7, you may have heard that FSA's are underway. The Foundation Skills Assessment is an annual province-wide assessment of all B.C. students' academic skills in grades 4 and 7, and provides parents, teachers, schools, school districts and the ministry with important information on how well students are progressing in the foundation skills of Literacy and Numeracy. Students have until the beginning of November to complete the assessments and then the booklets will be sent off to be marked. Original booklets and scores will be sent to parents when they become

At Francois Lake Elementary school, we have chosen to highlight 10 virtues for the year, and we discuss one virtue each month during our assemblies. We began in September discussing the virtue of kindness. Virtues are character strengths, and they are essential to the optimal functioning of both individuals and societies. Virtues are important tools for students, as they support their personal development, academic integrity, social interactions, and prepares them for responsible citizenship. At the end of each month, teachers recognize a couple students from each class who have demonstrated exceptional growth in a virtue with a falcon award. The recipients of the falcon awards are posted on the Francois Lake Pac page.

Ask your child about the virtue discussed in October, gratitude: showing appreciation and thankfulness. Our FALCONS are Fair, Ambitions, Leaders, Creative, Optimistic, Natural and Successful.

Throughout the year, our school practices numerous emergency drills several times per year, including fire drills, hold and secure drills, etc.

Tuesday, Constable Brandon Nitz came to our school and helped our entire school practice the Lock Down drill. Our school was SILENT! They were absolutely quiet and did not respond to anyone banging on the classroom doors trying to get in. After the drill was done, Cst. Nitz asked for questions from students in the classrooms. Questions that were asked were, "What do we do if we are outside when there is a Lock Down?" Cst. Nitz said they should stay outside and go as quickly as they could to the Hall and wait for their teachers. Another question he was asked was, Can you have a Lock Down at home?" The answer was a resounding, "Yes!" And just like at school, kids hide away from windows and doors until a safe person tells them it's ok to come out. Cst. Nitz was impressed with the perceptive questions our student had asked.

We welcome costumes to school and look forward to seeing little folks dressed up! However, we do have two hard and fast rules to remind parents of:

X No masks.

X No replica weapons.

If students come with props, please be advised they will be bringing them at their own risk. The school will not be responsible for lost, damaged, or missing props.

Safety tips for children:

- Keep heads up, and walk (don't run) across the street. Watch for cars that are turning or backing up.
- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers.
- Carry glow sticks or flashlights to help be seen by drivers.

### 'Double Up Speech Arts'

Would you like to try something new and wonderful?

Teachers of Speech Arts are providing an opportunity in the month of November for new or returning students to try Speech Arts for four weeks for FREE!

The purpose is to share the fun of doing speech arts and encourage new students.

#### Who is eligible?

Anyone who hasn't been involved in Speech Arts lessons in the past year (or ever!) ages 4 to adult.

#### What's involved?

Students will work on a short selection for two or a brief solo. They may rehearse with a teacher (ask if you'd like to work with someone). You may also be self-taught, work with a parent (or other family member) for the month of November. Rehearsals can take place in person, or online. Teachers will be available for approximately 4 free 30 min. sessions of instruction during the month.

Consider working with another student! Either someone else who is new, or an experienced student to share their enthusiasm. Selections will be kept short. At the end of the four weeks there will be an opportunity to perform in a 'Double Up Recital' online between December 2 to 6.

FEEDBACK, certificates, scholarships and prizes will be given for participation. Details to come...
