Student Learning Survey 2024/2025

Dear Parents and Guardians of Gr. 4 and Gr. 7 students:

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents or guardians, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2025** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 and 7, their parents or guardians, and all school staff. We encourage parents or guardians to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey.

Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.




Morning movement: What a great way to start the Gr. 5/6/7 day!


If the kids can't skate, or ski on new snow, then they play soccer instead! We've got budding superstars!


Next Year's Kinders?

It's never too early to plan for the next school year!


