Literacy and Numeracy Assessments have been completed, Interim Reports have gone home, and parents have had the opportunity to meet with teachers at our Talk About Learning event where the student interim reports could be discussed. We are grateful for all of the parents who took the time to meet with teachers. Your engagement in your student's learning is extremely important.

We also were thrilled that some of our teachers were able to engage in professional learning regarding Thinking Classrooms with Dr. Judy Larsen. The Thinking Classroom model is designed to create an environment where students actively engage with mathematical or other concepts and develop a deeper understanding of the subject. They solved a problem that used critical thinking skills and mathematical reasoning; the open-ended question enabled students to collaborate to find solutions to the problem. Students visually represented their solutions and explained their reasoning to the problem that was being worked on.

On October 31<sup>st</sup>, students will be participating in a variety of activities in classrooms and in the school for Halloween. Please ensure that you **keep all masks and props at home** and save them for the evening festivities, instead. We want the day to be safe, filled with fun and wish to see all students able to participate in the day's learning and play activities.


