

### Principal's Message

Every member of our team is valued and plays an important role in the smooth running of our little school. When an employee is sick and unable to report to work, this person is rarely replaced due to a shortage of casual employees. As such, I am intentionally choosing this topic of employment as my message to families. If you or someone you know might be interested in working on a casual or full-time basis, please contact the school district. Currently, our school has vacancies for the following positions:

- Indigenous Advocate Worker (2 hours per day)
- Reading Club Worker (0.5 hours per day)
- Relief noon hour supervision (0.75 hour per day)
- Relief after school supervision (1 hour per day)
- Relief custodian (evening shift: 4.5 hours per day)
- Casual shifts (on call) for all positions.

If you like the flexibility of being on call (being able to accept or decline shifts), then you could apply to be on the casual list. You can specify one or more schools you would be willing to work at and you can select which days would work with your schedule. The demand is high, and the supply is low!

Please note that there are days when Mrs. Vossen is away with no replacement. On these days, I will do my best to answer the phone calls but may need you to leave a message so I can retrieve it at my earliest convenience. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding. As I like to share often with the Francois Lake staff, we're doing the best we can. It isn't going to be perfect but we'll do our best – and that's all we can ask.
