Please note, your emergency contact is for emergencies when we can't reach you — the parent or guardian.





Code of Conduct

The Purpose of our Code of Conduct is to provide a safe, caring and orderly environment. Our expectations are that students will maintain an attitude that is cooperative, courteous and respectful.

At Francois Lake Elementary School, we:

Take care of others – be considerate of others' personal feelings and properties

- a. Share ideas and solve problems together
- b. Plan with others
- c. Get along with others
- d. Use language to resolve conflicts
- e. Manage powerful emotions
- f. Wait for a turn

Take care of ourselves - care about your learning and yourself, including safety

- Take safe physical challenges
- b. Use a number of strategies to reach a goal
- c. Independently follow daily routines
- d. Be interested and curious
- e. Plan ahead
- f. Manage powerful emotions
- g. Struggle through the hard parts to learn something new
- h. Pay attention even when it's hard

Take care of this place – care about your school and your environment

- a. Manage your belongings
- b. Cleanup after yourself
- c. Put garbage/recycling where it belongs
- d. Protect school equipment
- e. Respect animals and plants

As stated in Canada's Human Right Code: discrimination, especially in terms of race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, and age, is prohibited in our country, and in our school.

At Francois Lake School, personal digital devices must be powered off and safely stored during the entire school day, from the time the student arrives on school grounds until they leave school grounds. This extends to instructional time while off school property (e.g. field trips). Personal digital devices may only be used during the school day for instructional purposes and to promote digital literacy, and only with the permission and direct supervision of a teacher or other staff member.

Francois Lake Affairs...

Inappropriate behaviors can consist of, but are not limited to:

- > Rudeness, swearing
- Fighting (or play fighting)
- Lack of respect for others, teasing
- > Throwing objects (rocks, sticks, snowballs, playground woodchips, etc.)
- Defiant behavior, insolence, refusing to respond to reasonable requests from school staff members
- Running in the halls or classrooms
- Unauthorized leaving of the school grounds
- Littering
- Vaping

Consequences:

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner, respecting individual rights, responsibilities, age and maturity; and be restorative rather than punitive in nature.

*Consequences take into account the student's age, maturity, and special needs if any. Special considerations may apply to students with special needs

**All reasonable steps will be taken to prevent retaliation by any person against a student who has reported a breach of conduct.

Inappropriate behaviors may have the following consequences - (level of consequences to increase with repeat incidents):

- Review of expectations and a timeout
- Review of expectations, and/or loss of privileges
- > Parents are informed
- Meeting with the parents
- Restorative service work
- Short-term (in school or at home) suspension up to 5 days
- Long-term suspension (over 5 days) or referral to district program
- Consultation with police and/or fire department
- Expulsion

Safe & Caring School Environments:

are free from acts of:

- > Bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment and marginalization
- Threat and intimidation
- Violence in any form
- Abuse in any form
- Discrimination in any form including race, color, gender, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, ancestry or national origin
- Retribution against a person who has reported incidents or misuse of:
- Cyberspace/Cell Phones/Electronic Devices/Computers students are to be aware that they may be subject to discipline (or, if applicable, confiscation of personal property) for misuse of technology if it negatively impacts on the school environment.

Forms of unacceptable conduct cited above are only some examples. It is not an all-inclusive list.

Do Not Tolerate the Presence of:

- > Theft and vandalism
- Intoxicating and banned substances
- Weapons or replica (toy) weapons (including knives) and explosives
- Intruders or trespassers all visitors to the school must first report to the office

Notification

As circumstances warrant, administrators have a responsibility to advise other parties following a behavior incident:

- Parent of student exhibiting major behaviors (in every instance)
- Parent of student on the receiving end (in every instance)
- > Assistant Superintendent, Safe Schools team member and/or other District Staff
- Ministerial agencies and/or School Liaison Officer (Police)

The Board of Education believes that the responsibility for student discipline in school is shared among students, staff and parents. Students have a responsibility to respect the rights and dignity of others and to become actively and productively involved in their own academic learning and social growth.

- Educators are responsible for establishing a positive school climate in which structure, support and encouragement assist students
 in developing a sense of self-discipline, responsibility and positive relationships.
- Parents are responsible for establishing a positive learning atmosphere in the home, knowing school policies and procedures, supporting the school in the enactment of these policies and procedures, and encouraging their children to understand and respect these policies and procedures.

Code of Conduct Policy No. 301.5

The Board of Education, School District No. 91 (Nechako Lakes), believes that students and staff work and learn most effectively in an educational environment that is mutually respectful, safe, and healthy. It is the Board's expectation that the personal information of students and their families be shared only where necessary for the educational well-being of the child and that this information be shared with the appropriate agencies only when required for the child's well-being. It is expected that this respect is also shown for staff and their families.

To that end, the Board requires all staff to promote values which foster respect for all members of the school community and to support positive means of resolving differences. These values shall align with the core beliefs and values of the district, as well as with the *BC Human Rights Code* which prohibits discrimination on the grounds of race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age, mental or physical disability, gender identification/expression, sexual orientation or sexual orientation as perceived by others.

It is expected that school codes of conduct will now include one or more statements about what is unacceptable behaviour including bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, intimidation, threatening or violent behaviour while at school, at school related activity, or in other circumstances where engaging in the activity will have an impact on the school environment.

The Board believes that the responsibility for student discipline in school is shared among students, staff, and parents.

- Students have a responsibility to respect the rights and dignity of others and to become actively
 and productively involved in their own academic learning and social growth.
- Staff are responsible for establishing a positive school climate in which structure, support and encouragement assist students in developing a sense of self-discipline, responsibility, and positive relationships.
- Parents are responsible for establishing a positive learning atmosphere in the home, knowing school policies and procedures, supporting the school in the enactment of these policies and procedures, and encouraging their children to understand and respect these policies and procedures.

To support these aims, the Board has established a District Code of Conduct for Students and has set up the requirements for schools to work with their school communities in order to establish a School Code of Conduct reflective of the School Act and Regulations, and following the guidelines outlined in Safe, Caring and Orderly Schools, A Guide (Ministry of Education, 2004), as well as the BC Human Rights Code, amended July 2016, and the Provincial Standards for Codes of Conduct Order, Ministerial Order 276/07, amended on September 7, 2016.



DISTRICT CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Related Policy: 301.5 - Code of Conduct

Each student* in the district is required to adhere to the District Code of Conduct for Students and Codes of Conduct established at the school level.

It is expected that students will:

- 1. Respect the rights of others within the school community including peers, staff, parents and guests;
- 2. Work to the best of their abilities with the goal of continuous improvement;
- 3. Follow the directions of staff, recognizing the right to have decisions reviewed that affect them;
- Respect the school's physical school facilities, equipment and the property of fellow students.
 Students (or their parents) may be held financially responsible for repairs or replacement of property willfully damaged;
- Respect the diversity of our school community and the BC Human Rights Code which prohibits
 discrimination on race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age, mental or physical
 disability, gender identification/expression, sexual orientation or sexual orientation as perceived by
 others.
- 6. Conduct themselves in a safe and responsible manner at all times;
- Not threaten, harass, bully, intimidate or assault, in any way, any person within the school community. This includes cyber bullying;
- Not be in possession of any object that, in the opinion of the Principal/ Vice Principal, is potentially
 dangerous. This includes any weapons, legal or illegal, including replicas/imitations.
- 9. Not be in possession or under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or other prohibited items.
- Not be in possession of or use tobacco, drugs or vape type products in school buildings, on school trips or on school property; and,
- Adhere to the regulations of student conduct on school buses.
 (See Policy and Regulations 406.1 Student Transportation to and from School).

^{*} Special considerations apply to students who are unable to comply with the Codes of Conduct due to having a disability/condition of an intellectual, physical, medical, sensory, emotional or behavioural nature.
