Earlier this winter, we had an unfortunate loss. Our Chinook salmon eggs were collected above the Farwell Canyon slide in the Fraser watershed and the eggs were fertilized under stress. This causes high mortality for fry, and FLES' fry all perished during hatching.

Luckily, Oceans Canada was able to replace the eggs with Coho salmon eggs which are growing and thriving as hoped! Over the next few weeks, we should see some fry as part of our school's daily science exploration!






### **STEM**
